




# Year 9 GEOGRAPHY

Key Learning		Pre-Exposure Tasks	Linked Fiction
Autumn 1	<p><b>Weather and Climate</b></p> <p>Study important aspects of processes and the ways in which they impact upon people. Explore what is meant by weather and climate and how weather is recorded. Consider micro-climates and complete an investigation of the microclimate around school. Explore the causes and impact of precipitation and how weather (including hurricanes) affects human activity.</p>	<p>Watch different weather forecasts – look for changes shown by the weather, what happens with wind or rain patterns and identify 5 key terms used in a weather forecast and find out what they mean.</p>	 <p><b>The Girl of Ink and Stars</b> Kiran Hargrave</p>
Autumn 2	<p><b>Development</b></p> <p>Explore the development compass rose and the North/South Divide. Study statistical techniques, such as choropleth maps and scatter graphs. Investigate indicators of development. Consider why some countries are rich and other countries are poor and why the continent of Africa is so poor. Learn about fair-trade and how it can help development.</p>	<p>Identify 5 key terms used in a development and find out what they mean.</p> <p>Investigate the North South divide in the UK – what facts and figures support a difference within the UK eg the cost of housing.</p>	
Spring 1	<p><b>Tectonics</b></p> <p>Learn about the structure of the earth and why we have earthquakes and volcanoes. Explore what can be done to minimise the damage from them.</p>	<p>Research an earthquake or volcano: Where is it? When did it happen/erupt? How many people live there? Spring 2	<p><b>Diverse Asia</b></p> <p>Study the diverse nature of Asia as a continent. Explore the physical landforms found within Asia and the differing climates.
